


Westedge Blvd. is anticipated to reopen by November 23

Metropolitan Council Environmental Services (MCES), operator of the Twin Cities metro area wastewater collection and treatment system, continues to construct a new lift station and maintenance facility on the north side of Westedge Blvd., near Setter Circle. For the next few months, crews will finish upgrading the sewer and water pipes and complete temporary restoration of the road, allowing Westedge Blvd. to reopen by November 23. Throughout the winter, crews will be onsite working inside the maintenance facility. No road restrictions will be associated with this work. Please anticipate crews to return onsite in the Spring of 2017 to complete final pipe connections and permanent restoration of the road.

Until Westedge Blvd. fully reopens, please be aware of a few things:

- All residential driveways will remain open, but since there will be excavation on Westedge Blvd. the road will be completely closed (there will be no access through the work zone)
- If you live on Setter Circle or to the west of Setter Circle, you will need to access your property from the west
- If you live to the east of Setter Circle, you will need to access your property from the east

Please follow posted detours to navigate around the closure and work zone. After the work beneath Westedge Blvd. is finished, restoration and temporary curbs will be installed, with full restoration occurring in the Spring of 2017.

Other project impacts

While we do our best to minimize impacts during construction, some other temporary inconveniences may occur as the work takes place, including general noise, lights and dust, construction equipment placement, short-term utility disruptions (any residents with short disruptions will be notified in advance) and short-term 24-hour pumps for maintaining sewer service while certain activities occur.
